BOOK REVIEW

A HISTORY THAT REACHES OUT

Naomi Rosenblum's A World History of Photography lets us know that things have happened in photography in places besides France, England and the United States and that there have been great photographers besides Bresson, Brandt, and Adams. Basically this work of 600 plus pages is about more than art photography, but that is the main theme.

It is very good. Sometimes there is carelessness, as when Weegee's Naked City is listed as being published in 1936 rather than in 1945. But, you'll learn from this book, you'll think and maybe you'll see stronger if you have your bookstore order it for you from the Abbeville Press, New York. It costs about \$50.00- that's less than six cents a picture. (803 illustrations)
